## HISTORIC RAINFALL, YET STILL WE PROTECT OUR MOST VALUABLE RESOURCE

Although Kern County has

received record rainfall this

year, conserving water is still

critical to maintaining our

long-term water supply.

Oildale Mutual Water Company (OMWC) views water conservation as a top priority. From our beginnings in 1919, our company has consistently provided quality water at a fair cost to our committed stockholders. Clean water is a limited natural resource in high demand - our mission is to safeguard this regional supply by promoting effective water conservation practices.

Practicing water conservation is truly a way of life and has a positive impact on our community and local economy. At Oildale Mutual, we continue to remind our customers of the

importance of water conservation and how vital it is to our region. Although Kern County has received record rainfall this year, conserving water is still critical to maintaining our long-term water supply. Currently, the county has a secure reserve with extensive snowpack growth - reaching 200% higher than the state average. This growth has led

to an increase in water allocations; however, it's always wise to continue to conserve water in preparation for future droughts.

Here are some simple household tips and tricks to help conserve water this summer as temperatures

start to rise:

Fixing leaks is perhaps the number one way to reduce water leaks and fix them as soon as possible.

Prepare your summer watering plans and adjust the watering schedule to suit the weather conditions.

Install drip irrigation in your garden.

Water lawns during the morning or evening - avoid midday at all costs to prevent water loss through evaporation, especially in the summer heat. Also, when temperatures are cooler, the soil absorbs water more effectively.

Check your sprinklers! Adjust sprinkler heads or install a


smart controller to make automatic adjustments. In addition, avoid misting sprinklers as the water easily evaporates.

When cleaning your patio or driveway, opt for a broom instead of a hose to remove unwanted leaves and yard clippings - this can help drasti-

cally save water over time.

- 1. Minimize the time spent with water running unnecessarily in the bathroom. For instance, shorten showers and turn off the faucet while brushing your teeth. Also, opt for a quick shower rather than soaking in the bathtub.
- 8. Run full loads! Make sure your dishwasher and laundry loads are at maximum capacity to reduce cycles and water use. Check your dishwasher and washing machine settings before running loads!
- 1. During California's warmer and drier months, it is recommended to water lawns only twice a week. Verify with your local water agency which days watering is allowed.

- 10. Plant California native drought-resistant plants that require little to no water.
- Review your lawn and garden layout to ensure optimized watering efficiency. By appropriately planning landscaping projects in spring, you'll help your plants still thrive during the summer heat. It's important to keep your plants and landscape healthy during these drier months.

Although these are simple tips, remember every little bit contributes to securing our regional water supply.
